- 1. **Call to Order:** Schuyler called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM.
- 2. Limited Public Comment: None
- 3. Approval of the Agenda
  - a. Motion by Vidak to approve the agenda with support by Pepper; Motion carried 4-0-2
- 4. Approval of the Minutes from July 25, 2022
  - a. Motion by Vidak to approve the agenda with support by Pepper; Motion carried 4-0-2
- 5. Business:
  - a. WSCC Open-Entry, Open-Exit Programs(OE/OE), Dr. Mark Kinney
  - b. Development Plan Language Review
    - Motion by Vidak, supported by Pepper, to recommend the following language change in the Mason County Promise Zone Development Plan, under the Eligibility Criteria Section, addressing residency and graduation:

## **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:**

In order for a student to be eligible to receive proceeds from the Mason County Promise scholarship, a student must meet criteria for Residency, FAFSA completion, Enrollment and FERPA Release as defined below:

- 1. Graduation and Residency Requirement:
- A. Reside in Mason County for at least one full school year, including the student's graduation year, and graduate from a public or non-public high school located within Mason County; or
- A residence is defined as the primary residence.
- Public or non-public schools must be registered and recognized by the State of Michigan or the West Shore Educational Service District.
- Home Schools are considered an eligible non-public school if registered with the West Shore Education Service District for at least the student's graduation year.

- c. Books & Technology Update:
  - i. Chair Schuyler asked Dr. Kinney for his thoughts on the potential helpfulness of a book and technology award as part of a success initiative, to which he responded, "It would be fantastic." Kinney added that even with more OER materials, some programs require software or books that cost as much as \$600 at the beginning of a program, and that though various pockets of aid exist, not all students are eligible for it.
  - ii. Motion by Vidak to recommend including Books & Technology Awards in the development plan as a part of participation in defined Student Success Initiatives as approved by the Board, with support from Schuyler; Motion carried 4-0-2.
    - 1. Maloney & Schuyler will draft language for the Committee to review at the September SSC meeting.
- d. Adding Additional Years:
  - i. Motion by Quillan to recommend amending the development plan to allow for up to 6 years of utilization, supported by Pepper; Motion carried 4-0-2
