

## **Mason County Promise Zone**

## Student Success Committee Meeting Minutes Monday, November 25 2024: 10 AM Location: Lakeshore Resource Network

1) Call to order: Vidak called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM.

2) Public Comment: None

- 3) **Approval of Agenda:** Motion by Pepper to approve the agenda, supported by Surd; Motion carried 5-0-2.
- 4) **Approval of Minutes**: Pepper noted an amendment needed to include a third advisor, Cheyenne Schulte, in item 5a. Motion by Jewell to approve the minutes with amendment, supported by Pepper; motion carried 5-0-2.

## 5) Business:

- a) **Growth Discussion Follow-Up**: Exploring options for scholarship expansion to other institutions both for after high school and transfer, per Promise Board.
  - i) Reviewing data: Maloney provide an overview of the following existing information:
    - (1) Trajectories
    - (2) Transfer: All Institutions Transfer Costs Estimates: Costs range from \$180,000 per cohort, to \$480,000/cohort, based on a \$1500/semester award for up to 4 semesters (or 2 years) depending on how "transfer" is defined; graduation from WSCC as a transfer requirement is the least expensive option. This award is generally based on the amount that a full-time 12-credit load at WSCC would cost. The Promise must provide at least the amount of funding required to complete an associate degree, so that is based on a 2 year (4 semester) award of \$1500 (minimum amount for full-time at WSCC).
    - (3) Out-of-High School: Community College Expansion Considerations: Students who take full-time classes and graduated in 2023 and after qualify for the Michigan Community College Guarantee, which covers in-district tuition. Maloney shared that MiLEAP would approve a Promise offering to cover the cost of out-of-district tuition for scholars at CCs across the state. Benefits to offering a Community College-based award are that it may allow students to access programs that aren't offered locally.
    - (4) Out of High School: All Institution Cost Estimates
      - (a) Universities with a Tuition Guarantee for Pell-Eligible
  - ii) Questions for further consideration: Did not Cover all questions.
  - iii) Additional Questions or Information Needed: Requests included:
    - whether some private institutions are willing to make "deals" with Promise Zones;
    - how Zones are getting information about total financial aid awards back from institutions;
    - examining additional data related to awarding a flat \$3000 as a flexible award for up to 2 years for any Michigan institution;
    - to awarding a flat \$3000 scholarship for up to 4 years for any Michigan institution;
    - to maintaining the scholarship as-is at WSCC and adding a 2 year flat, flexible award that could be used as a transfer scholarship after WSCC or as an initial scholarship for students who begin their college career elsewhere;
    - understanding graduation rates and costs/debt for students at other institutions in Michigan;
    - how a full-time or part-time requirement might impact students;



- more information about persistence and time to degree at state-based institutions.
- b) Feedback from outgoing WSCC Completion Coach: Maloney shared about b.i, and b.ii, but item b.iii was not discussed due to running out of time.
  - i) Students, especially those right out of high school, are in survival mode, even those whose financial needs are met; cohort-based success coaching would be invaluable
  - ii) Students who "know their why" are more focused
  - iii) Opportunities exist to partner with higher ed. institutions like UofM to provide funding for CC students to visit transfer college campuses
